**Wednesday, March 14 at Lakeland High School at 6:30 p.m. will be the last opportunity** to attend the public presentations of the **More Than Sad: Teen Depression** program being offered by Suffolk Public Schools. Suffolk Public Schools is bolstering its student mental wellness curriculum and building a stronger safety net for Suffolk teens by engaging parents and caring adults in a new, division-wide initiative. Partnering with The Sarah Michelle Peterson Foundation, Suffolk Public Schools is starting conversations around a video created by the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention to educate staff, teens and the community about teen depression. These discussions are the first phase of an initiative the school division is undertaking to enhance support for students’ behavioral and mental well-being. “More than Sad: Teen Depression” is a video designed to help students recognize the signs of depression in themselves or others, to challenge the stigma surrounding depression, and to learn how to ask for help. All Suffolk tenth-graders will see the video in their Health & PE class. A trained mental health facilitator along with school guidance counselors will then lead a discussion about depression. A companion version of the video and adult discussion will be shown to high school teachers and

support staff, and to parents and the community before the student discussion at each school. Adults will learn about warning signs, what to say, and how to guide teens to help. #### **WANTED: Preschoolers for Integrated/Role Model Program for 2017-18 School Year ...**

Suffolk Public Schools is currently looking for parents of children without delays who are interested in exploring the opportunities provided to all children in this classroom following the 2016-17 elementary school schedule at no cost to the parent, with transportation being provided via school bus. Suffolk Public Schools operates classrooms for children who are developmentally delayed (delays in cognitive, motor, communication or perceptual skills), ages 3 to 5. The integrated/role model program at Driver, Kilby Shores, Booker T. Washington, Oakland and Northern Shores elementary schools offers the opportunity for children without developmental delays or disabilities to join the preschool classroom daily to develop friendships and learn together through play. To be considered for enrollment/interview, students must reside in the city of Suffolk and be 3 years old by September 4, 2018. #### **Early Start Pre-Screening Applications Now Available ...**

The Early Start program is for children who turn 4 years old by September 30, 2018 and who need an extra year to prepare for success in kindergarten. Children must be Suffolk residents. Prescreening applications are available on the Suffolk Public Schools website ([LINK here](#)) and in each elementary school. Screenings for both child and parent will take place in June. This screening will allow school officials to select children according to their needs. Appointment cards will be mailed to the home address. Eligibility criteria includes but not limited to these factors: Family income at or below 200% of the federal poverty guidelines (or below 350% for students with special needs or disabilities), family homelessness, parents/guardians lack high school diploma, and/or language and development assessment of child. Because Early Start classes are not located in each elementary school, school placement will be determined based on Early Start zoning. Transportation is provided. **Little Feet Meet -- Changing the World is a Team Sport...** More than 200 students from 11 elementary schools will participate in Special Olympics Virginia's Little Feet Meet on **Wednesday, March 28**. (Rain date: Friday, March 30) at King's Fork High School. Special Olympics is building stronger school communities across Virginia this spring, as thousands of elementary, middle and high school students come out to PLAY UNIFIED. The focus is on fun activities that are important to mental and physical growth. The goal of the Little Feet Meet is to bring together children with and without disabilities to promote more inclusive school environments. "Our athletes face a number of foes and opponents each day but none is more pervasive than low expectations," said Special Olympics Virginia President Rick Jeffrey. "The community's support of UNIFIED PLAY events like the Little Feet Meets shows a commitment to celebrating what our athletes and communities can achieve together." The meet, which will begin at 11 a.m., will feature children enrolled in Suffolk's special education programs. From the 25-meter walk/run and the tennis ball throw to the standing long jump, the athletes will compete with the help of non-disabled students from their schools, who will serve as buddies. A special ceremony, featuring remarks from prominent members of the community, the Special Olympics oath and the Special Olympics' torch and cauldron lighting, begins at 11:30 a.m. King's Fork High School students also will serve as the primary volunteers running the Little Feet Meet. A Student Leadership Team will be in charge of the stations and the rest of the student body will help throughout the day. 
