OPENING OF PUBLIC MEETING/WORK SESSION

Call to Order:

The meeting of the Policy Review Committee delayed the start of the meeting of the School Board. Chair Riddick called the meeting to order at 5:04 p.m.

➤ LEAD SPS:

Dr. Stenette Byrd III, Chief of Schools, with the assistance of Dr. Karen Sanzo of Old Dominion University, provided information regarding Suffolk Public Schools partnership with ODU. Through the LEAD SPS-ODU Aspiring Leaders Cohort, participants can graduate from the program with a Master's degree and or an Education Specialist degree. This partnership will develop and foster leadership qualities in students via live courses which will be taught virtually via Zoom, on site in SPS, or at ODU's Tri Cities Center. The SPS-ODU Cohort is student-centered where students are able to develop a robust network of educational peers and be a part of a strong community of educational leaders. The estimated cost of the program is \$14,200 per credit tuition and additional fees including books and SLLA. However, tuition rates may change based on board of visitors.

Board Members asked questions and were excited about the partnership between Old Dominion University and Suffolk Public Schools.

> Special Education Annual Plan:

Ms. Towanda Shirley, Director of Special Education, presented information regarding the Special Education Local Annual Plan for the 2023-2024 school year that will be submitted to the Virginia Department of Education by May 12, 2023. The application must be submitted annually in order to receive federal funds for special education under Title VI-B of IDEA 2004. These funds must be used only for the provisions of special education services and related services to students with disabilities.

According to the annual spending plan, IDEA Part B, Section 611: For school-ages children, the plan will pay the salary and benefits for some special education teachers, some special education teacher assistants, job coaches, and bus assistants. The application allocation is

\$3,346,438. For IDEA Part B, Section 619: Children ages 3-5 years, the plan will pay the salary and benefits for a special education (preschool) teacher. The application allocation is \$66,816. Ms. Shirley recommended that the Board approve the Annual Plan and application.

Board Members asked questions and thanked Ms. Shirley for her presentation.
