#### High School Scholarship Competition

#### 2023 ESSAY TOPIC

#### WHEN SHOULD SUPREME COURT DECISIONS BE REVERSED

As a general proposition, our Constitution gives the United States Supreme Court final authority to determine what The Constitution's provisions require, what they permit, and what they prohibit. The Court's most recent ruling(s) in such areas are "the law of the land"; they apply to governments, organizations and citizens, who must make decisions and conduct their lives in conformity with them.

Occasionally, even after a Court's decision has been in effect and relied on for many years, the Court is asked to reconsider that decision and possibly to overrule it. In very rare instances, the Court does overrule. In fact, the Court has only reversed course on 146 occasions since 1789 – less than one-half of one percent. Some of these decisions include <u>Gideon v. Wainwright</u> overruling <u>Betts v. Brady</u>, <u>Bob Jones Univ v</u> <u>USA</u> overruling <u>Plessy v Ferguson</u>, <u>Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organ</u>. overruling <u>Roe v. Wade</u> and <u>Citizens United v. Fed Elec Comm'n</u> overruling <u>McConnell v. Fed Elec Comm'n</u>.

We're interested in your opinions about the following:

ASSUME that some of the Justices are inclined to believe the Court's prior decision is incorrect.

What considerations or factors should those Justices take into account as they try to determine whether to overrule it? Please be specific -- among other things, is it enough that the Justices disagree with the <u>result</u> of the prior decision?

Applications <u>on this form</u> must be complete and must be <u>RECEIVED</u> no later than 5:00 p.m. on <u>Thursday, May 18, 2023</u>. <u>Email is preferred but not required</u>. Applications that do not include all required attachments (please see the list of items set out below) or that are late <u>will</u> <u>not be considered</u>. <u>THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS</u>. PLEASE READ CAREFULLY and FOLLOW ALL INSTRUCTIONS.

Please mail (the Foundation cannot be responsible for delays in the US mail and all documents must be **received** by the deadline) or deliver all **five (5) copies** (one original plus four photocopies of the originals are acceptable) **of each** of the following: your (1) <u>application, (2) essay, (3) transcript, (if it comes in a sealed envelope, you may open the sealed envelope to copy) (4) <u>letter of recommendation from a teacher or guidance counselor, and (5) any information, such as a FAFSA form, to support your claim of financial need</u>. If you prefer, your completed application, essay, transcript, letter of recommendation, and FAFSA form (if you need financial assistance) may be scanned and emailed to: <u>rhpowell@kaufcan.com</u>. <u>Emailing scanned documents is preferred</u>. If the required materials are emailed, only the original needs to be scanned and sent – the scanned and emailed copies will be sufficient.

Unless all required documents are emailed, you must submit <u>five (5) copies or sets</u> of each of the following <u>five (5) items</u> (Why 5 copies if delivered by hand or mailed? – One for each of 3 judges, one for the Chairman of the Scholarship Committee, and one for the NPBA offices):

- 1. Your completed essay of approximately 500-750 words not including title, footnotes, or bibliography;
- 2. Your completed and signed Scholarship Application;
- 3. A letter of recommendation from a teacher or guidance counselor at your school;
- 4. A copy of your most recent school transcript; and
- 5. Any information you choose to submit that would support your claim, if any, of your financial need. You may use the FAFSA form that can be found at <a href="http://www.fafsa.ed.gov">http://www.fafsa.ed.gov</a>

or the application for financial assistance you might have submitted with your college application.
