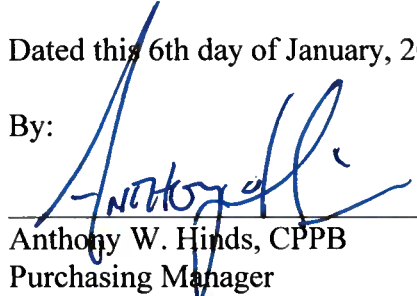

TERMS OF THE AGREEMENT

The initial term of this agreement shall begin on the date of award continue through June 30, 2024 after which this agreement may be extended for four (4) additional one-year periods, beginning July 1st and ending June 30th of each year, unless otherwise terminated by either party by giving written notice by May 1st of any given year. The School Board may approve a price increase for each subsequent year. The request shall be presented in writing by April 1st of each year and the cost increases shall not exceed the Consumer Price Index (CPI) as developed by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U. S. Department of Labor, for all Urban Consumers (CPI-U) south, for the preceding calendar year. Suffolk Public Schools reserves the right the purchase of additional equipment and services for other schools as needed and to negotiate for additional years of service agreement in order to provide for the continuation of services.

Suffolk Public Schools will pay, per year, per provider a yearly fee of \$33,000 per provider for the services outlined in this procurement. The initial assignments will be to provide one provider at King's Fork High School and one provider at Lakeland High School. These providers will cover games for the middle schools that take place at their assigned schools.

Additional providers may be added upon mutual agreement to meet the needs of the program throughout the term of the contract.

Physicals are hereby awarded at the agreed upon rate and terms found in the RFP.

NONDISCRIMINATION

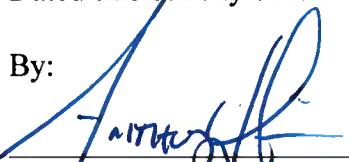

The School Board may approve a price increase for each subsequent year. The request shall be presented in writing by April 1st of each year and the cost increases shall not exceed the Consumer Price Index (CPI) as developed by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U. S. Department of Labor, for all Urban Consumers (CPI-U) south, for the preceding calendar year. Suffolk Public Schools reserves the right the purchase of additional equipment and services for other schools as needed and to negotiate for additional years of service agreement in order to provide for the continuation of services.

Suffolk Public Schools will pay, per year, per provider a yearly fee of \$72,458 per provider for the services outlined in this procurement. The initial assignment will be to Nansemond River High School. This provider will cover games for the middle schools that take place at their assigned school.

Additional providers may be added upon mutual agreement to meet the needs of the program throughout the term of the contract. PRNs may also be provided at a rate of \$50.00 upon mutual agreement.
